

## Update on Positive Cases, Outbreaks and Lockdown #6

We are now into the fifth week of Lockdown #6 (it started on 5 August). As previously reported, the glimmer of hope is that by 23 September, the large scale sector of industry can increase to 50% when a sufficient proportion of Victorians (70%) have had their first vaccine dose AND that 90% of building and construction workers have had their first dose AND that the numbers of mystery cases in the community are sufficiently managable enough to keep the health system from being overwhelmed.

However, your industry leadership has been informed at the highest level that this simply will NOT OCCUR whilst there is such a high level of NON COMPLIANCE being reported of basic COVID-19 protocols, in particular wearing FACE MASKS AT ALL TIMES. No amount of advocacy by your industry leaders can counteract frequent breaches of this basic rule being reported by members of the public to media outlets and being observed by the regulatory authorities.
